City of Bartlett, Tennessee Plan of Refunding General Obligation Public Improvement and Refunding Bonds, Series 2021

Dear Ms. Knotts:

The City of Bartlett, Tennessee (the "City") intends to issue general obligation refunding bonds to currently refund certain general obligation debt of the City. We are submitting this plan of refunding (the "Plan of Refunding" or "Plan") for your review pursuant to Section 9-21-903, et seq. of the Tennessee Code Annotated.

Proposed Plan of Refunding

In accordance with the City's Debt Management Policy, the City, together with its Financial Advisor, has determined that a refunding to realize debt service savings will be in the best interest of the City, and such decision complies with the City's Debt Management Policy, including meeting the required savings threshold.

The City plans to issue its General Obligation Improvement and Refunding Bonds, Series 2021 (the "Series 2021 Bonds"). The Series 2021 Bonds will:

- Currently refund the City's outstanding Water and Sewer Revenue and Tax Bonds, Series 2007 (the
 "Series 2007 Bonds") in the principal amount of \$395,000. The Series 2007 Bonds were authorized
 pursuant to resolutions adopted by the Board of Mayor and Alderman on July 24, 2007.
- Currently refund the City's outstanding Water and Sewer Revenue and Tax Bonds, Series 2009 (the "Series 2009 Bonds") in the principal amount of \$455,000. The Series 2009 Bonds were authorized pursuant to resolutions adopted by the Board of Mayor and Alderman on July 28, 2009.
- Currently refund the City's outstanding General Obligation Refunding and Improvement Bonds,
 Series 2010 (the "Series 2010 Bonds") in the principal amount of \$1,190,000. The Series 2010 Bonds

were authorized pursuant to resolutions adopted by the Board of Mayor and Alderman on July 13, 2010.

• Allow for the issuance of a portion of the Series 2021 Bonds as new money general obligation bonds to fund various City capital projects of \$3,488,500.

The proceeds of the Series 2021 Bonds will be used to: 1) to pay principal and interest on the Series 2007 Bonds, Series 2009 Bonds, Series 2010 Bonds; 2) fund \$3,488,500 of capital projects; and 3) pay certain costs of issuance on the Series 2021 Bonds. The Series 2021 Bonds are expected to be sold via competitive sale in late September 2021.

The Series 2021 Bonds attributable to the refunding of the Series 2007 Bonds and Series 2009 Bonds are also additionally payable from, but not secured by the City's water and sewer revenues.

Anticipated Debt Service Savings

The Series 2021 Bonds associated with refunding of the Series 2007 Bonds, Series 2009 Bonds and Series 2010 Bonds, referred to herein as the "Refunded Bonds", will be structured to provide proportional debt service savings.

Based on current market conditions, it is estimated that refunding the Refunded Bonds will provide net present value savings of approximately \$170,991 or 8.4% of the refunded par amount. The City's Debt Management Policy provides for a threshold of net present value savings shall be at least one and one half (1.5) times the cost of issuance associated with the financing.

The final maturity of the portion of the Series 2021 Bonds allocated to each series of the Refunded Bonds will not extend beyond the fiscal year in which the final maturity of their respective series of Refunded Bonds would have occurred.
